The harbor will be finished next fall if the war effort does not interfere with the construction. The harbor when completed will be the biggest small boat harbor in the world. There will be catwalks and room for about 300 crist craft boats.

Another bill, if a farmer or land owner finds crop damage from rabbits he or any employee on his land may kill the rabbits in any way he sees fit. With the exception of a ferrets and without a state permit. This years big game license can be used all over New York State.
