R. Babcock \$2.50 most fish

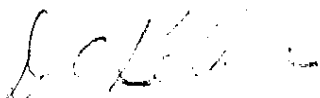
PICNIC COMMITTEE: M. Kobel read the final report of the family picnic, attached \$55.59 was turned back to the club; this was money made on the raffles.
