The Buffalo Rod and Gun Club Inc. strongly opposes the closing of Allegany State Park to all Sunday hunting.

The Club hereby petitions the Erie County Federation of Sports-
mens Clubs Inc. to convey its feelings to member clubs of the Feder-
ation.

Following is a list of some of the reasons why the Buffalo Rod and
Gun Club Inc. thinks that the hunter is being discriminated against
by this closing.

- (1) The hunting season in the park is less than 1/4 of the total year. The season starts about the first week in October and ends December 31.
- (2) Most working men can only hunt in the park on Saturday and Sunday, therefore a man's hunting time has been cut in half by this closing.
- (3) Hunters contribute much to the economy of the state and indirectly support the financial operation of this park, and therefore should be given a little more consideration.
- (4) Hunting and non-hunting areas of the park are well marked.
- (5) The park is well supervised and patrolled at all times during the year and more so during the hunting season.
- (6) Other users of the park have not been penalized by such restrictions, why should the hunter?
- (7) Hunting accidents and violations in the park have been few by comparison.

The Buffalo Rod and Gun Club Inc. respectfully submits this petition to the Erie County Federation of Sportsmens Clubs Inc. and requests its full support in furthering its aim.

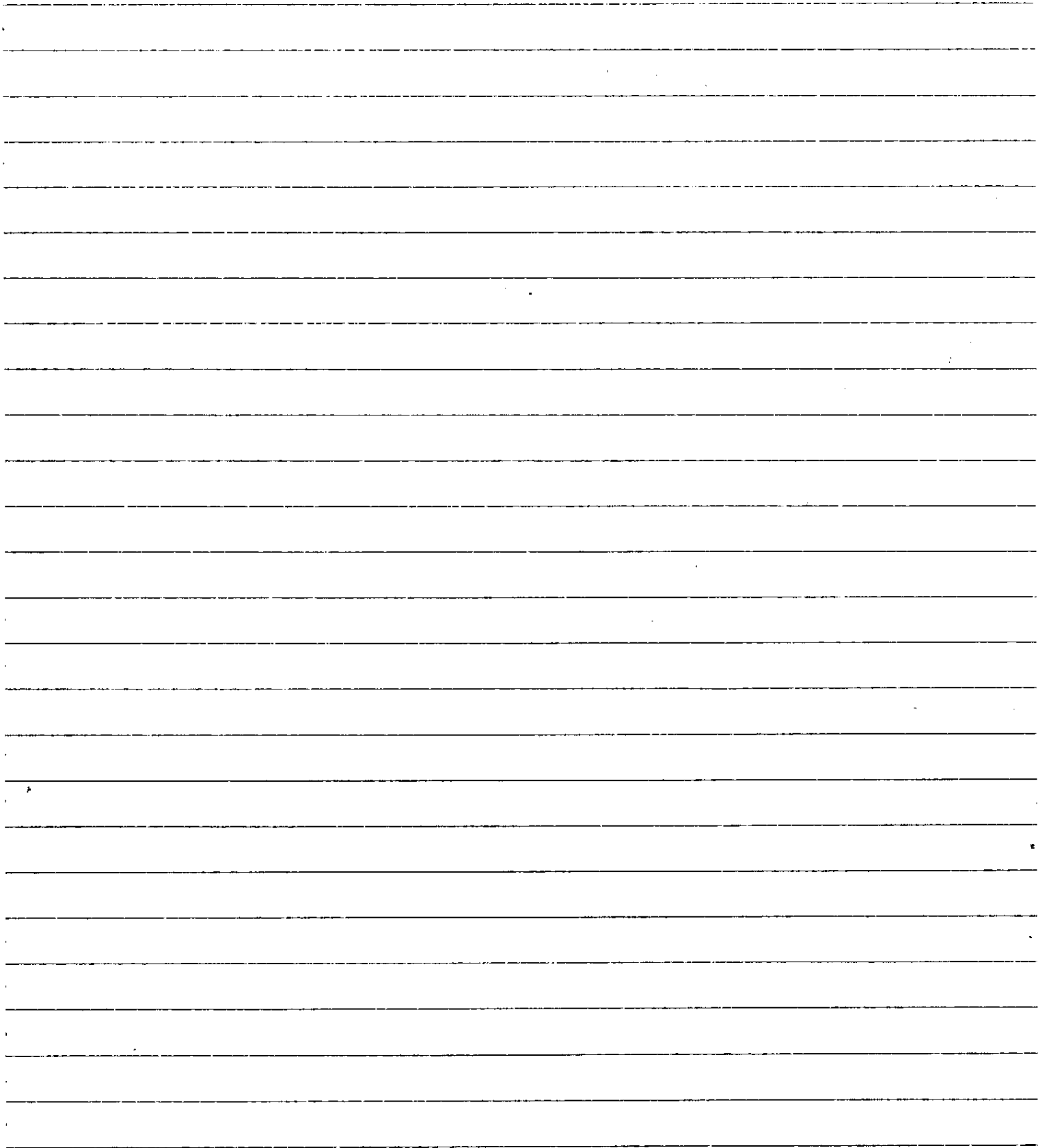
