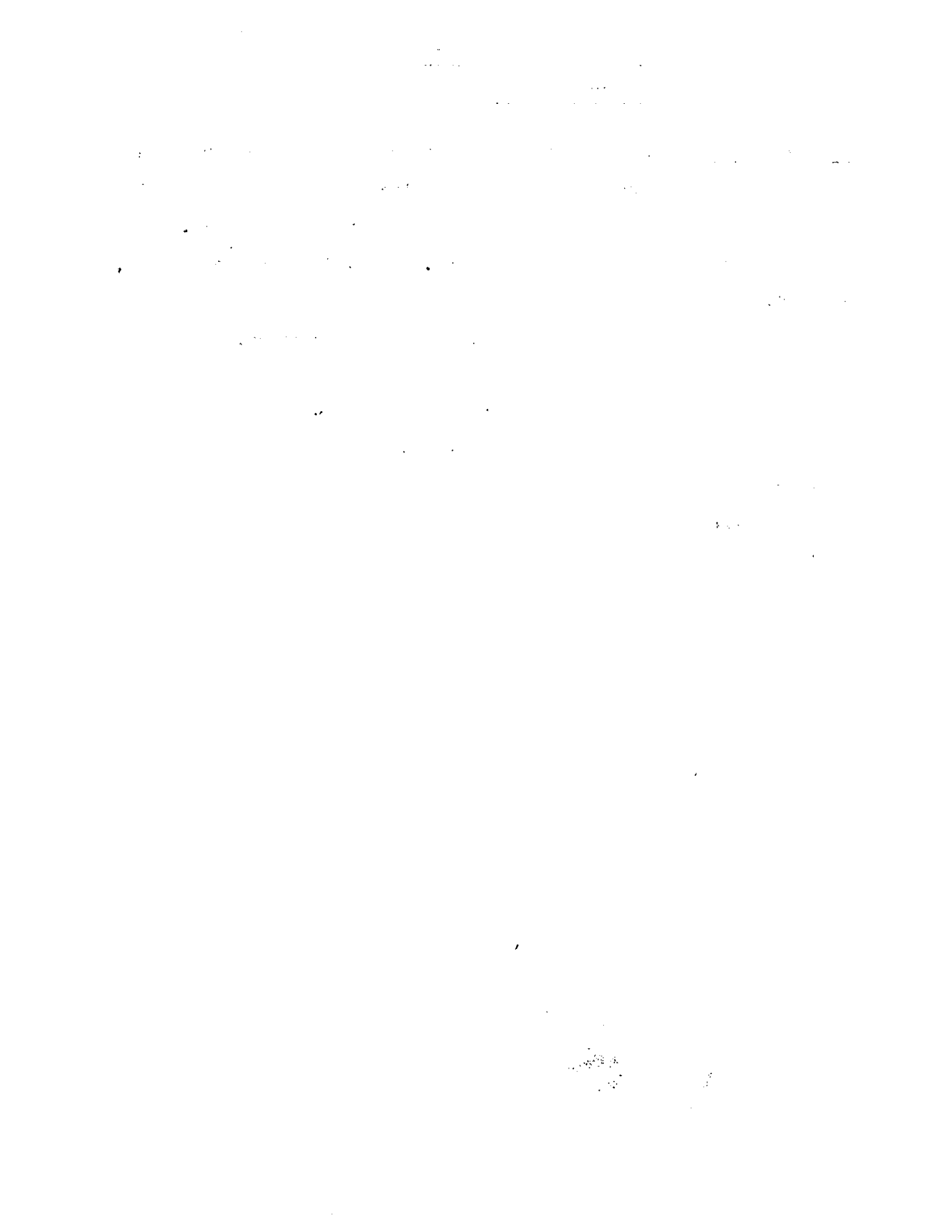

Board of Director's Meeting: The purpose of this meeting was to amend the By-Laws. In addition, following changes were made:

Effective Immediately:

Work Parties: All members, except those with 30 years service or any health problems, are expected to work an 8 hour day on one of the scheduled work days, or be subject to a fine or assessment to be determined by the Board of Directors.

Shotgun Deer Season: During the first week, the camp and cabin facilities, for the purpose of deer hunting, are for members in good standing only. An immediate family member such as a son or daughter, if accompanied by a member, may have use of the camp privileges for the remaining weeks of deer season. However, the regular camp rules apply whereas all members have first rights to the bunks and any other privileges. Non members are not permitted to hunt at any time during shotgun season.

Effective in 1993:

- The initiation fee will be \$75.00 for new applicants and must be accompanied with the application.
- The membership will be limited to 45 members. Presently we are limited to 55 members.

Camp Rushford: The Buffalo Rod & Gun Club will sponsor and pay the tuition of a member's son or daughter for one week to the summer camp at Camp Rushford, if the member is in good standing at the time and has been a member for one year.

Salaries & Free Dues: The salaries for the Secretary and Treasurer will end at the end of year 1992 and the free dues that they receive will remain in effect as long as the present Secretary and Treasurer remain in office, after that, this will also be eliminated. In addition, the free dues afforded the writer, publisher of the monthly news letter will cease at the year end of 1992.

NEW MEMBER: Frederick Lawrence, sponsored by D. Zilbauer and P. Gervase, was sworn into the membership of the club.

E.C.F.S.C. On September 26, the Alden Sporting Club is sponsoring a seminar for interested kids to give them a first-hand "hands on" experience in hunting and fishing. M. Zaller volunteered to attend the E.C.F.S.C. meetings held the 2nd. Thurs. of each month.
