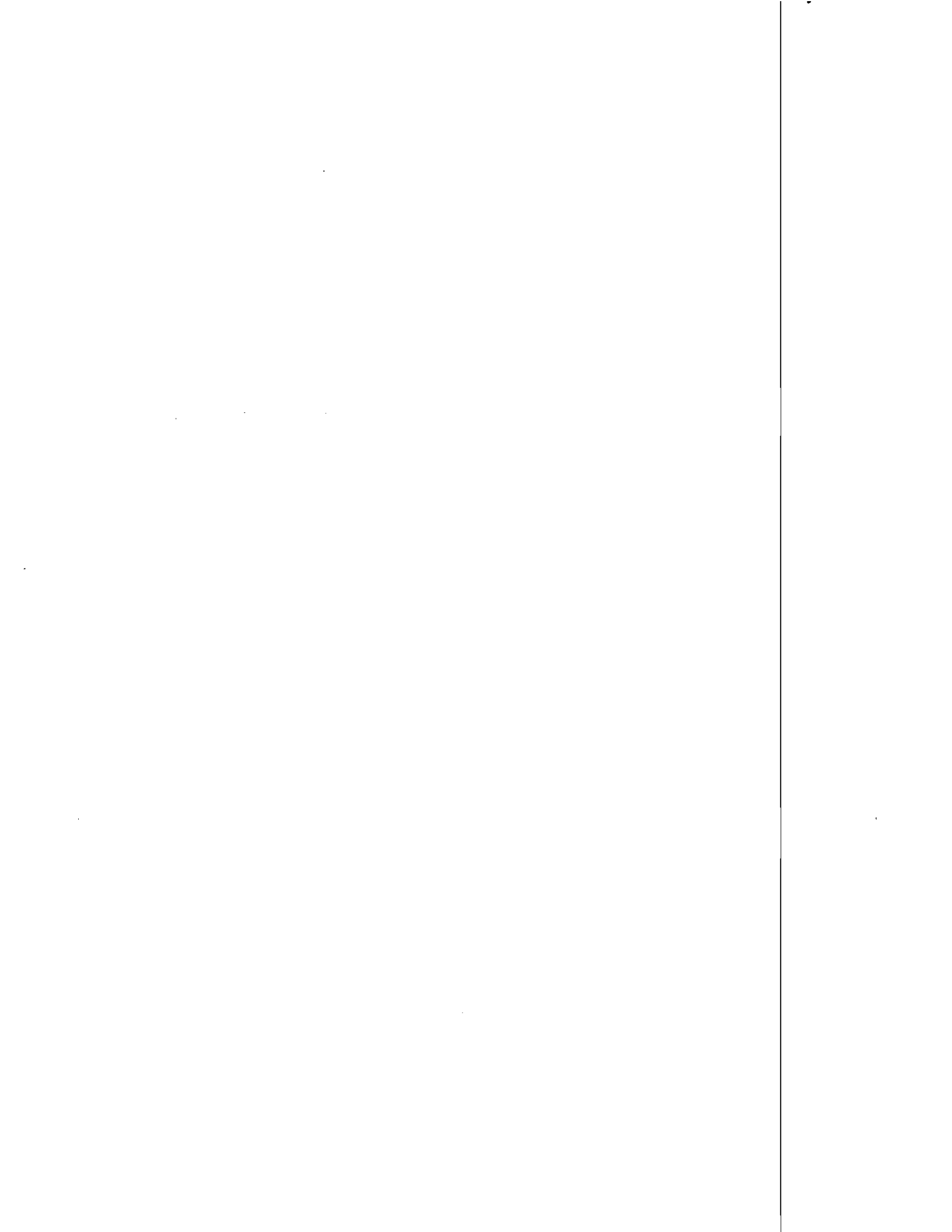

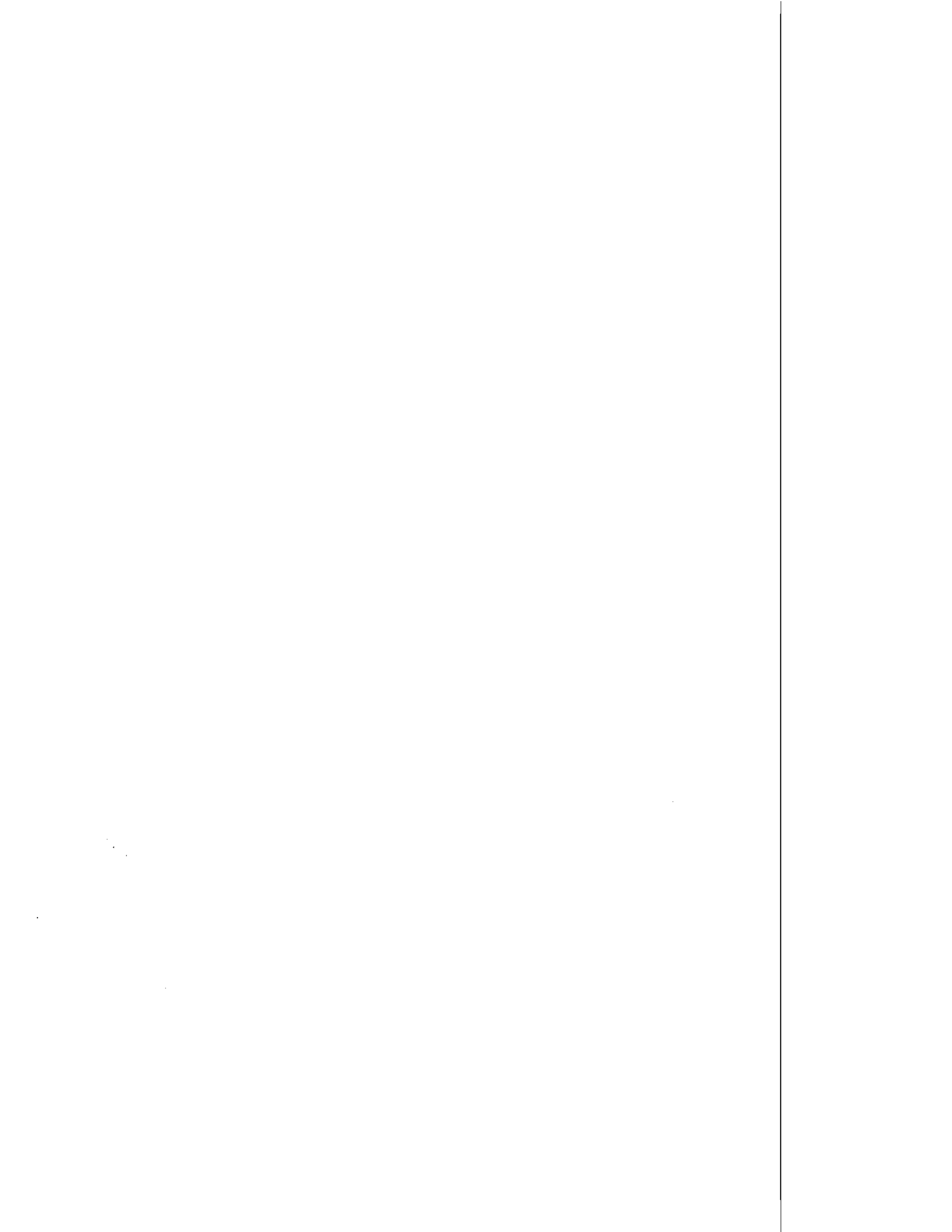

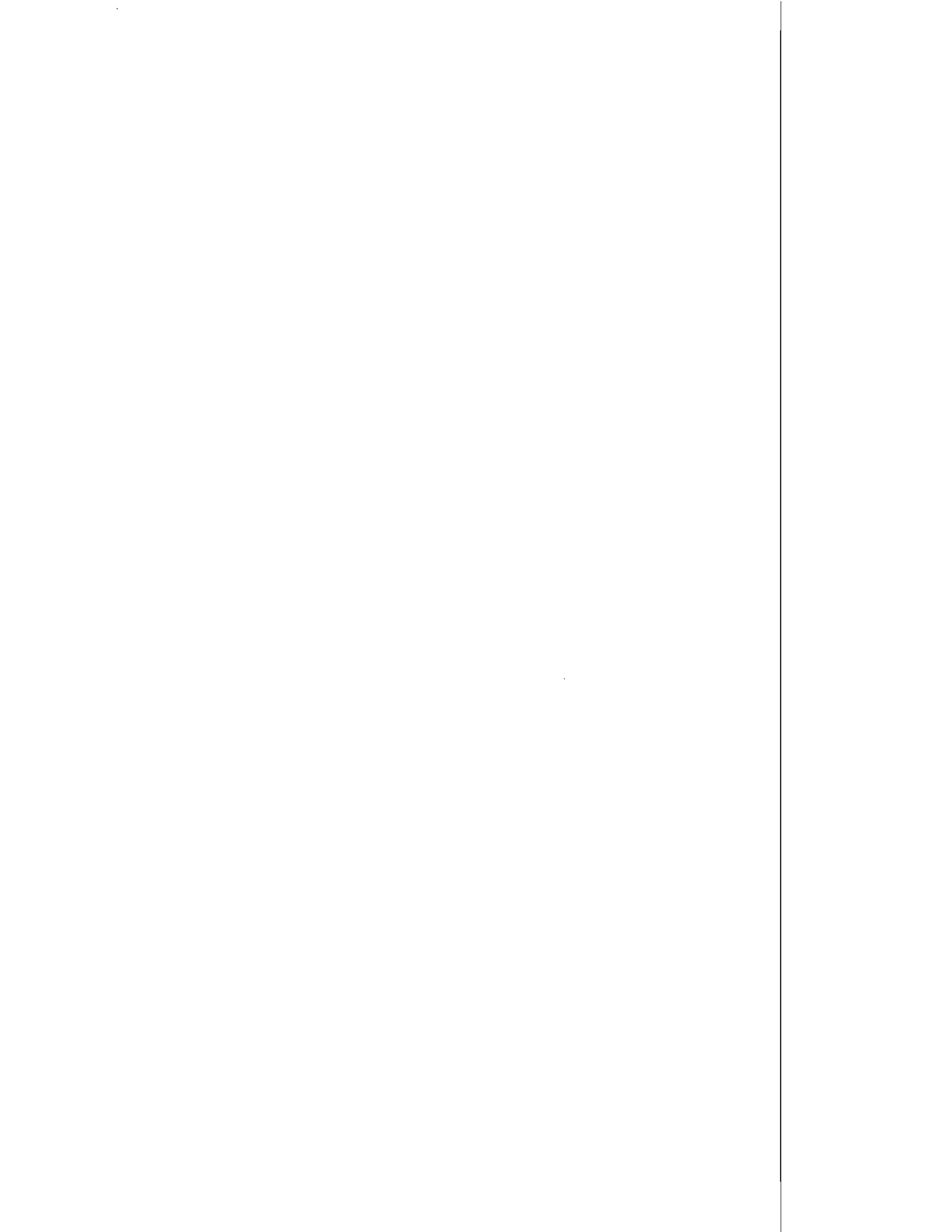

IT WAS NOTED THAT ANGELLO PARLATTO AND PAUL LUTHER WERE BOTH OUT OF THE CLUB.

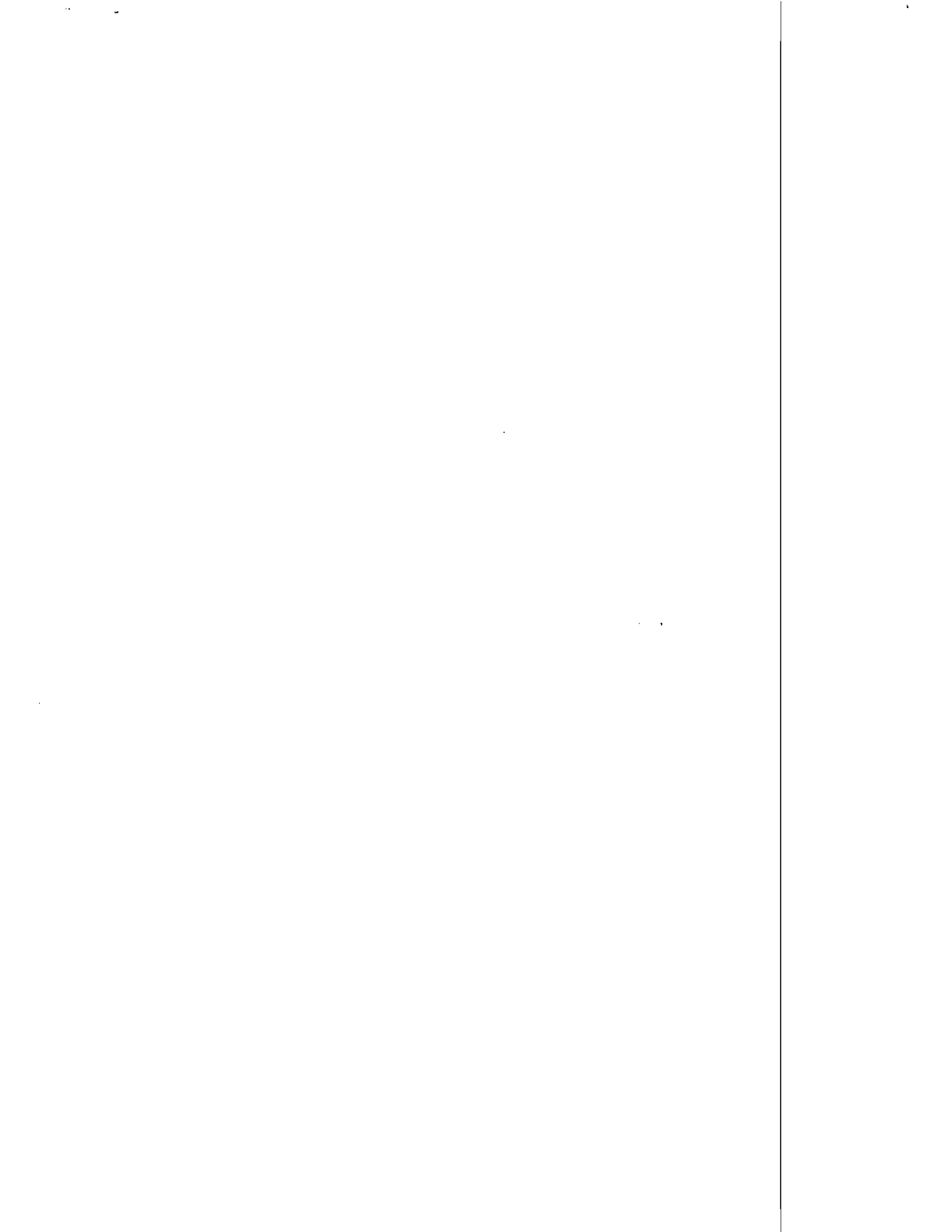
