UNFINISHED BUSINESS: Plans for a stag membership party are being formulated at camp by the shooting committee.

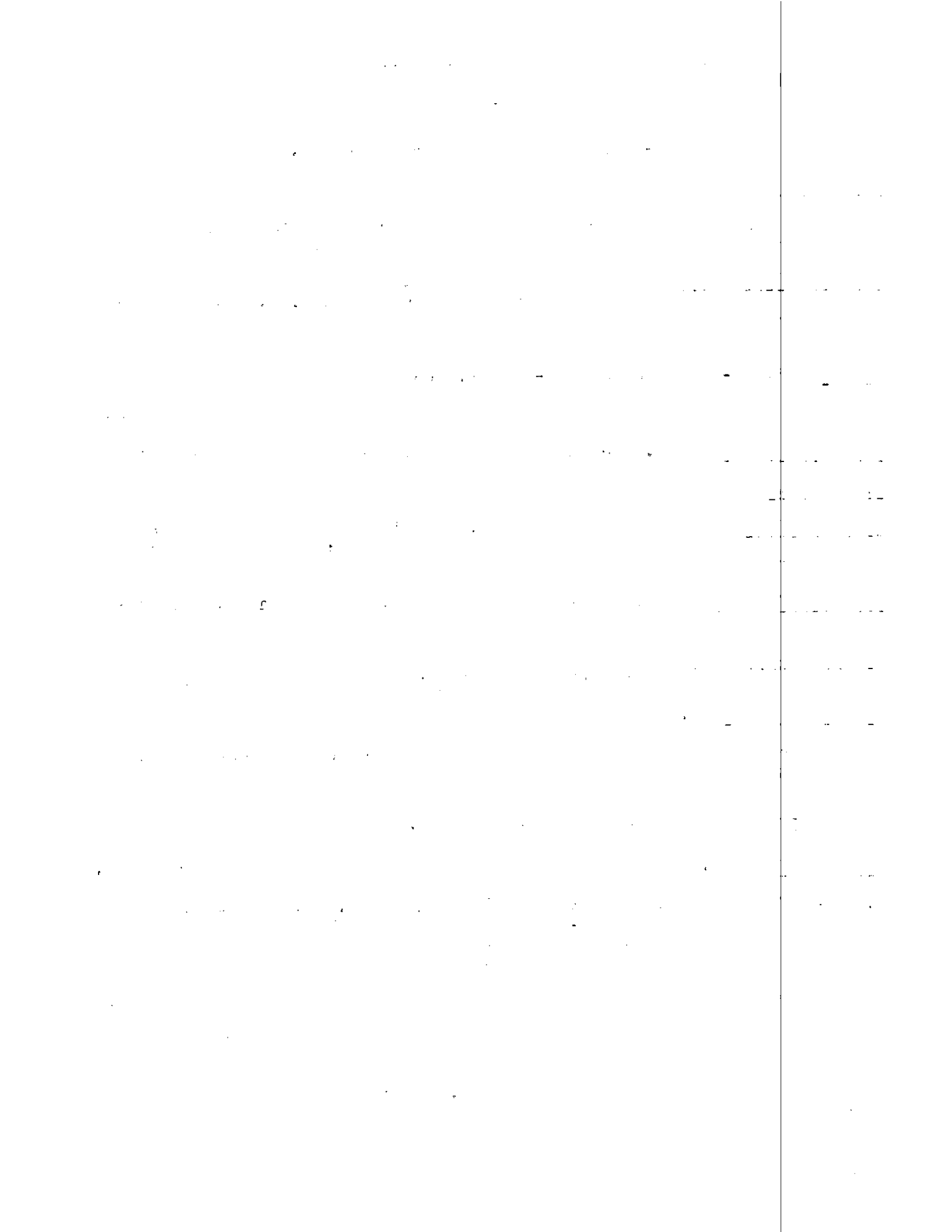

young men enjoyed themselves as much as we enjoyed having them.

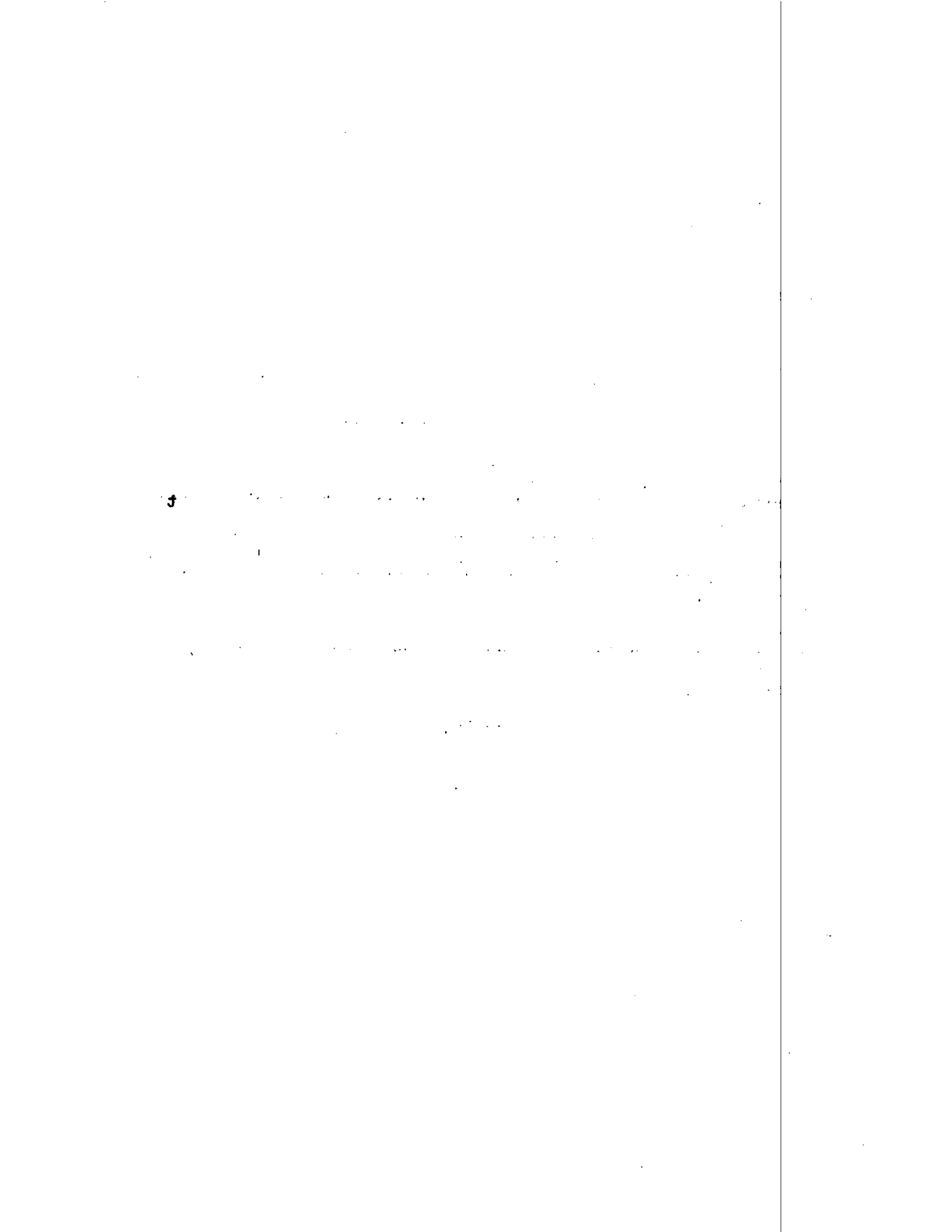

NEW BUSINESS: Marty Wiesner made a motion, seconded by Dave Grupp to purchase two bottles of gas for the furnace, carried.

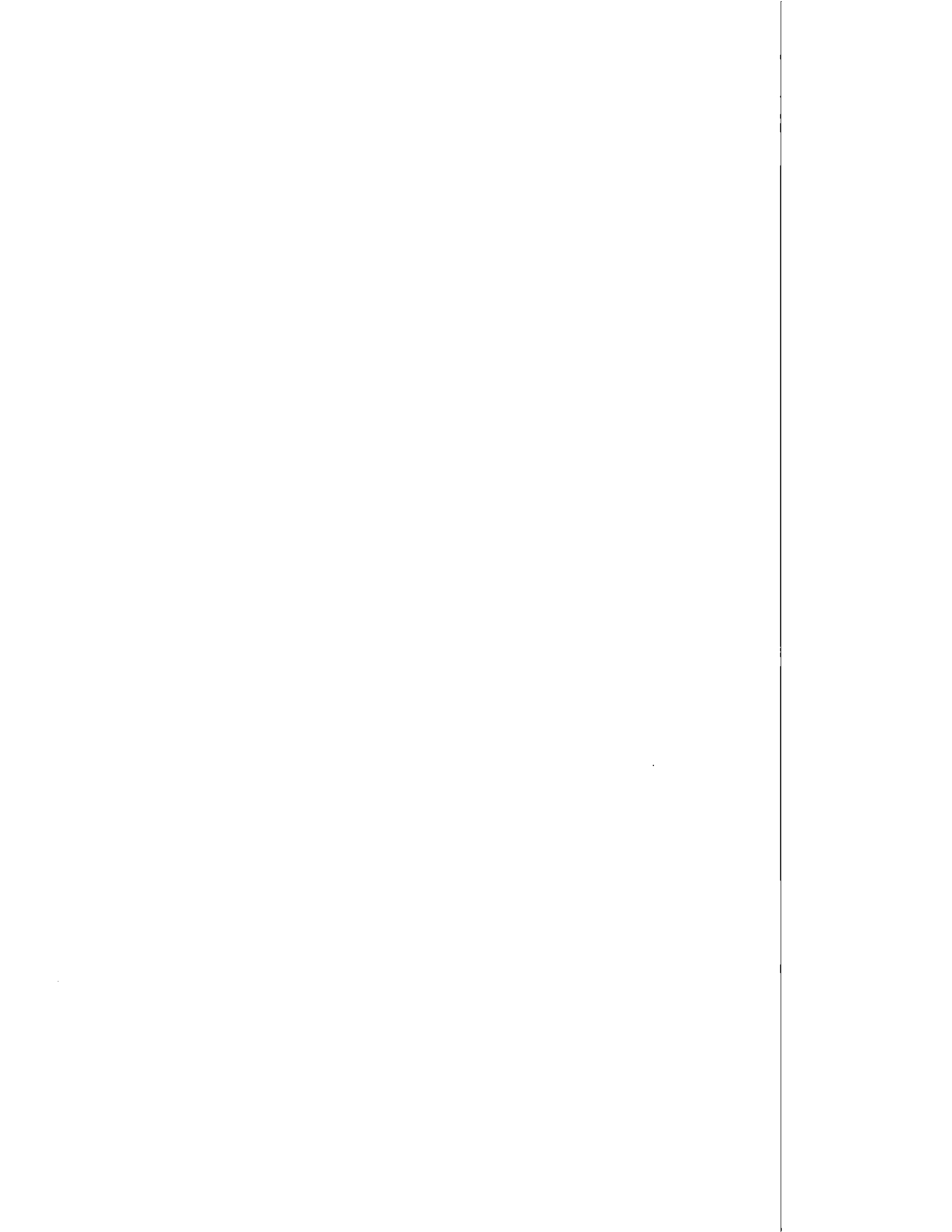
