members present.

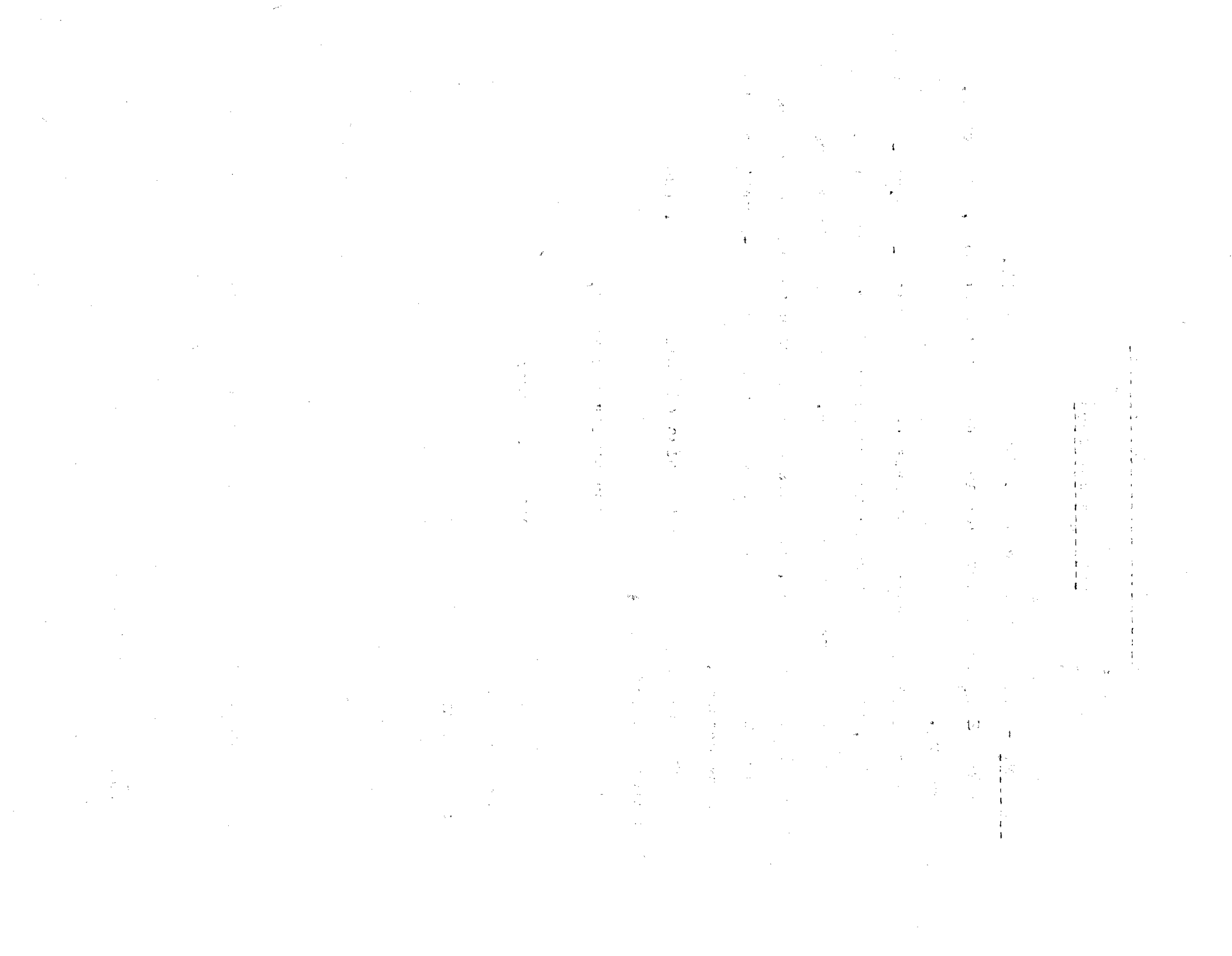
