

MINUTES OF OCTOBER 18th B.R.G.C. MEETING

2001

ROLL CALL OF OFFICERS ---- DON KELKER WAS ON VACATION --- ALL OTHERS, PRESENT.

THE READING OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING'S MINUTES WERE READ, AND ACCEPTED ON A MOTION BY GEORGE FELDMAN, AND SECONDED BY MARTY WIESNER.

IN HIS TREASURER'S REPORT, MARK ZALLER NOTED THAT THE CLUB TREASURY BALANCE, WHICH INCLUDES OUR C.D. , OUR REGULAR CLUB FUNDS, MONEY FROM OUR RECENT LOGGING DEAL, AND INTREST , STANDS AT A HEALTHY SUM OF \$38,948.77. THIS REPORT WAS HAPPILY ACCEPTED ON A MOTION BY JACK GREEN, AND A SECOND BY DAVE RACZKA.

THE FOLLOWING BILLS WERE PAID AFTER A MOTION BY GEORGE FELDMAN WAS SECONDED BY MARTY WIESNER. ---- NIAGARA MOHAWK -- \$40.14 ; AN INSURANCE PREMIUM INCREASE OF \$316.35 ; AND \$174.37 TO TIM MURPHY FOR VARIOUS CAMP IMPROVEMENTS.

CAMP CHAIRMAN, JOE NEUBERT REPORTED THE SEPTEMBER WORKPARTY AT THE CABIN WAS VERY PRODUCTIVE ---- THE NEW SHED IS ALMOST FINISHED, AND A LOT OF WOOD WAS CUT UP, SPLIT, AND STACKED.

CONSERVATION REPORT: BOB RACZKA MENTIONED THAT NIAGARA COUNTY IS GIVING AWAY FREE ELM TREES DUE TO THE SPREAD OF BEECH BLIGHT.

SHOOTING COMMITTEE: BOB RACZKA HAD A FEW COMMENTS ABOUT HIS RIFLE RANGE SHED BEING MOVED. HE ALSO HAD SOME IDEAS TO REVAMP AND IMPROVE THE TRAPHOUSE.

POND COMMITTEE: GEORGE FELDMAN SAID THE POND WILL BE FINISHED IN A WEEK OR MAYBE TWO, DEPENDING ON HOW WELL MOTHER NATURE CO-OPERATES. THE REASON IT'S NOT DONE NOW IS BECAUSE OF ALL THE RAINFALL DURING THE POND CONSTRUCTION. HE STILL HAS TO LEVEL OFF THE DIRT AROUND THE POND, AND SEED THE AREA. HE WANTS TO SEED WITH TIMOTHY, SINCE IT ATTRACTS DEER. HE ALSO SPOKE OF SPREADING STRAW OVER THE NEW SEED. HE REPORTED FURTHER THAT THE TREE STUMP AT THE TOP OF THE DRIVEWAY WAS REMOVED, AND THE GROUND AROUND THE AREA WAS LEVELED, AND TWO LOADS OF ~~GRAVEL~~ WAS SPREAD AT THE TOP OF THE DRIVEWAY, AND DOWN THE DRIVEWAY ^{AS FAR AS THE LAST BEND.}

UNDER NEW BUSINESS, A MOTION TO PAY FOR FORTY - FIVE TON OF ^{STONE} STONE, COSTING \$579.77, PAYABLE TO GEORGE FELDMAN, AND SEED TOTALING \$78.00 , PAYABLE TO BOB RACZKA, WAS MADE BY DAVE RACZKA, AND SECONDED BY MARTY WIESNER.

ON A REQUEST BY DAVE GRUPP, MARK ZALLER READ TO THE MEMBERS PRESENT AT THE MEETING, THE CONTRACT BETWEEN GEORGE FELDMAN, AND THE CLUB, REGARDING THE POND CONSTRUCTION.

A MOTION TO APPROPRIATE \$250.00 FOR CHRISTMAS GIFTS FOR ALEX GIZOWSKI, VIC STRONG, AND MRS. GERZAK WAS MADE BY GEORGE FELDMAN, AND SECONDED BY MARTY WIESNER. THE GIFTS ARE TO AMOUNT TO \$100.00 FOR ALEX ; \$100.00 FOR VIC STRONG, AND \$50.00 FOR MRS. GERZAK.

TIM MURPHY ASKED FOR \$50.00 FOR KEN MOSER TO PURCHASE POSTERS FOR THE CAMPGROUNDS, WHICH WOULD GIVE ANY TRESSPASSERS WARNING OF THE POND. THIS WAS GRANTED AFTER A MOTION BY DAVID GRUPP, AND SECONDED BY KARL NAGEL.

GEORGE FELDMAN ASKED FOR \$200.00 FOR EXTRA WORK DONE AT THE CABIN WITH THE HEAVY EQUIPMENT HE RENTED. THIS WORK HAD NOTHING TO DO WITH THE POND ITSELF. IT WAS FOR THE REMOVAL OF THE TREE STUMP AT THE HEAD OF THE DRIVEWAY, AND GRADING THE STONE ON THE DRIVEWAY. HIS REQUEST WAS CARRIED ON A MOTION BY MARTY WIESNER, AND A SECOND BY DAVE RACZKA.

CORRESPONDENCE: Secretary read a letter from Assemblyman, Richard Smith urging the membership to send letters to federal and state representatives for support of the National Sea Grant Program in regard to the ~~discovery~~ discovery of Type E Botulism in Lake Erie Sheehead.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: G. Feldmann returned \$510.00 to the Club from the \$1,000.00 allotted him to start the pond project.

E.G.F.S.C.: No report

CONSERVATION: The corn field was being cut last weekend and the clover field was half cut. The trees planted were doing well. Many turkeys and deer were seen.

SUNSHINE COMMITTEE: Past President R. Kerr is doing much better.

CAMP COMMITTEE: J. Neubert indicated there is much wood to be cut this Saturday at work day at camp.

SHOOTING COMMITTEE: A good time was had by all who attended the Sept. 8, shoot.

POND COMMITTEE: R. Raczka reported that he met with a representative of Chautauque County regarding our pond project. If the County handles the pond construction, an Engineer will supervise the project for 10%. They send out bids and handle the construction. The dozer costs \$1,000/day and it should take 8 days. They will push soil back around the bank. He thought our design was good. After much discussion a recess of the general meeting was called and the Board of Directors met and decided to enter into contract for the construction of the pond with G. Feldmann. M. Zaller offered to check the insurance aspect, and to write a contract for the project.

NEW BUSINESS: D. Roedl made a motion, seconded by J. Neubert to enter into contract with G. Feldmann to build pond to existing drawings, top dress and seed and relocate rifle range; carried. For the record, President T. Murphy felt we should go for more bids. G. Feldman planned on finishing the construction this year; whereas, if we went with someone else, it could be next year. J. Neubert made a motion, seconded by M. Wiesner to appropriate \$150.00 for the September work party, carried. Pres. T. Murphy appointed R. Raczka, R. Zaverl, and G. Feldmann to the nominating committee for the October election of club Board of Directors. They nominated K. Moser, M. Zaller, D. Kelker, G. Feldmann, J. Green, M. Wiesner, R. Raczka, D. Raczka, J. Neubert, K. Nagel (declined), and D. Smith (declined).
